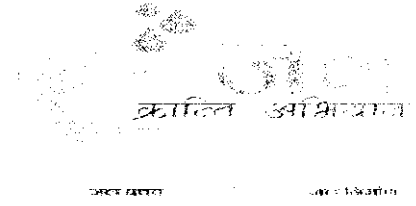

**Comments / Views of Brahmaputra Board on point 9 of the representation of Reception Committee, of 85<sup>th</sup> Annual Session of Srimanta Sankardeva Sangha, Assam, dated 05.02.2016**

1. Brahmaputra Board was constituted by Government of India by an Act of Parliament in the year 1980 with objectives of planning and integrated implementation of measures for control of floods and bank erosion in the Brahmaputra and Barak Valley and for matters connected therewith. Brahmaputra Board had started its functioning since 1982 and formulated 62 river basin/sub-basin Master Plans; which include Master Plan on Main Stem of Brahmaputra River and its tributaries out of which Disang, Dikhow and Jhanji fall in the district of Sibsagar, Assam. Recommendations have been made in these Master Plans for control/tackling of floods and erosion in the river basins/sub-basins of the region. The implementation of the recommendations made in the various Master Plans is required to be taken by the concerned State Governments.

2. Water, being a State subject, the flood control, anti-erosion and flood proofing works are planned, implemented and funded by the State Governments as per their own priorities and the Central Government renders assistance which is technical, catalytic and promotional in nature. Accordingly, the Government of India assisted the State Governments with various flood and erosion management schemes up to the X Plan under Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) and during XI and XII Plan under Flood Management Programme (FMP). During X Plan under CSS an amount of ₹ 146.20 crore was released to all NE States out of which amount released to Assam was ₹ 78.81 crore. Similarly, during XI Plan, under FMP, an amount of ₹ 1109.05 crore was released to all NE States out of which amount released to Assam was ₹ 783.81 crore. During XII Plan period, Government of India has approved 41 schemes for the State of Assam with an estimated amount of ₹ 1387.42 crore for execution under FMP. Thus, Government of India has been extending all kinds of assistance for mitigation of flood and erosion problem of Assam as and when required.

3. Further, Brahmaputra Board takes up Flood Control and Anti Erosion Schemes on request of State Government and approval of Central Government. As requested by Government of Assam and approval of Government of India Brahmaputra Board has taken up following Schemes for implementation:

4. Flood and erosion problem of Brahmaputra river basin have National / International ramification. Decision on declaring the flood problem of the Assam as a 'National Problem' of the country may be considered on this backdrop. Brahmaputra Board does not have any reservation if flood and erosion problem of Assam is declared as 'National Problem'.

5. Regarding long term solution of flood and erosion problem in Brahmaputra Basin, Brahmaputra Board conceptualized a proposal of River Stabilization measure in the main stem of Brahmaputra". Views/ Suggestions from CWC, WR Department, Assam and Assam Engineering College, Guwahati were obtained on this proposal. For finding out its efficiency a mathematical modal study had been carried out in collaboration with IIT, Guwahati, which is under progress.
